CLERK PLEADS FOR SIX O'CLOCK CLOSING
 DOUGLAS, March 27, To the Editor: An agreement is being circulated among the business men of this town for signatures pledging them to close their stores at 6 p. m., except on the 16th and 17th days of each month and on Saturday evenings.
 It seems to me that the agreement should be signed. The business men of this town ought to be able to do what has been done in other towns of more and less population.
 The indications are that an eight-hour day will go into effect at an early date. That will make it particularly easy for everyone to do his shopping before 6 o'clock.
 Six o'clock closing will not only benefit the clerks that now stay in the stores 13 and 14 hours a day, but it will benefit the proprietors. With it in effect they would have a chance to show people that they are more than mere machines. How many business men in Douglas attend the shows, fire meetings, lodge meetings or other meetings such as they might attend if they had their evenings away from business?
 Proprietors and clerks alike would be benefited if they could give some of their time to these things.
 Six o'clock closing would not only make better conditions all around, but it would save the lighting bills 50 per cent in the winter time and this is quite an item in many of our mercantile establishments.
 The people would spend just as much at the stores. They could easily do their shopping in regular hours if they knew that the stores would be closed at a specified time.
 This agreement would have gone into effect two years ago when the question was first agitated if it had not been that three or four houses would not sign it. The men that blocked it think they are good business men, but I think they are short-sighted rather than long-headed.
 The agreement does not include pool rooms, saloons, ice cream parlors nor any of the places of amusement. It only includes the clothing, grocery, hardware and other mercantile establishments that deal in the necessities. Juneau can close at 6 p. m., why can't Douglas?

LEVY'S YUKON LAUNCH ARRIVES
 Louis Levy's new launch, Marinice, arrived last night from Petersburg in charge of Frank Walter, who will be its chief navigator on the Yukon river. The trip was made from Petersburg in 13 hours.
 The Marinice was built on San Francisco Bay and shipped to Ketchikan. It came from that place to Juneau under its own power, and will proceed to Skagway, from where it will be shipped over the White Pass and launched again at Whitehorse. It is intended for use on the Yukon river, and will replace a smaller launch formerly used on that river by Mr. Levy in connection with his occupation as a fur buyer. It is 32 feet in length and is provided with highly improved engines, capable of developing a high rate of speed.
 Frank Walter, who has charge of the Marinice, is a native of Holy Cross Mission, Alaska, and for several years has been in the employ of Mr. Levy.
 The Marinice is lying at the sawmill dock, and has attracted a great deal of attention from local people.
