CREATING OFFICE OF TREASURER

Representative Svindseth today introduced a bill in the House providing for the creation of the office of Territorial Treasurer. An emergency is made to expire January 1st, 1915, and qualification of the incumbent if the bill becomes a law.

The bill provides that the first incumbent of the office shall be elected by the legislative assembly at a joint session in the hall of the House and that a ballot shall be taken each day until such officer shall have been elected. The term of the first incumbent is made to expire January first, 1915.

must have been a bona fide resident and citizen of the Territory at least three years prior to his election to the office. He must give a bond of \$100,000 which can be raised at the option of the governor at such time that in the opinion of the governor the funds in his custody warrant the increase.

The official residence of the treasurer is designated at Juneau and his duties require that he shall be the custodian of all the moneys of the Territory from whatever source, and to pay out of said funds by warrant only. The funds must be kept in not less than three banks or depositories and be divided according to the direction of a commission consisting of himself, the governor and the secretary of the territory.

The fiscal year will begin on January first of each year and end at midnight of December thirty-first of each year. Provision is made for reports, inspection of books, and punishment for misappropriation of funds. The treasurer's salary is fixed at \$4,000 a year.
