

DOUGLAS TO IMPROVE ST. ANN AVENUE

One of the projects of the new city council that is about to take up the reins of government in Douglas town—or "New Town", as the old timers used to call it—is the widening of St. Ann avenue. Time was when only a trail connected Douglas with its meal ticket, Treadwell. It was a rough trail, too; winding its devious and uncertain way through gulleys, and around stumps and cabins. It was a brave navigator who undertook the night voyage across a good lantern. Then came a narrow plank between the rails of the "upper track". When this was added to by a plank on the outer side of each rail we were making progress to beat the band. Rev. Cole was one of the prime movers in this great achievement. The Rev. Cole was one of the few preachers ever in Douglas whose interest in public affairs extended beyond the front door of his church.

Finally the present road was built. Then we decided that never, within a decade at least, would there be need for anything better. But now the old dirty road that leads to Treadwell is a disgrace to the community, and besides, it is too narrow for anything. Men, women, children, teams dogs and baby buggies jostle and dodge. It is the main thoroughfare of the island. Everybody travels it. We are growing, and we need bigger and better things every year.
