The customs mill at Fairbanks has begun crushing a shipment of gold quartz from the Russian Mission on the lower Yukon river. The owners of the property down near the mouth of the Yukon think they have a good property, and are having a mill test made.

At a meeting of the Native Sons and Daughters of the Golden North at Fairbanks, June 1st, eleven youths were admitted to membership. The membership of the society had reached respectable proportions before this accession.

R. E. Coyle, a farmer of Fairbanks, has ordered a harvester and binder for delivery at Fairbanks some time in July. It will be the second one in that section of Alaska, and is wanted for use in harvesting the 1913 grain crop. There are several mowers in the Tanana valley, but only one harvester. A threshing machine was shipped in two years ago.

Information from Fairbanks says there is much more activity this spring on Sullivan creek in the Hot Springs district than there was last year. All of the outfits that have been working on that creek and its tributaries are taking out good pay, and all have plenty of water with which to do their sluicing.

With the arrival of the Robert Kerr, one of the first boats to leave Dawson for Fairbanks this spring, the meat famine was broken at the Tanana valley metropolis. She carried 225 head of beef. The Schwatka that sailed from Dawson a few hours after the Kerr, carried 35 head. Both boats sailed from Dawson May 29th, and they arrived at Fairbanks June 6th.


