**FIRE DAMAGES  
DOUGLAS BUILDING**

DOUGLAS, June 23.—The Thomas building, opposite the postoffice was partly destroyed by fire today and all the occupants were heavy losers. The fire started about 11:30 o'clock from gasoline that was being used by Dr. Mathis, the dentist, who occupies offices on the second floor of the building. The gasoline became ignited, and the fire, resisting the efforts of Dr. Mathis to smother it out with a pillow, rapidly spread.

The fire alarm was sounded immediately after it was discovered that the flames had gotten beyond control, and the volunteer department responded promptly. It did excellent work, and the fire was under control before building was completely consumed, and they gave the fire no chance to spread. The ground floor of the Thomas is occupied by the Rexall drug store, and the second floor by Dr. Mathis and H. E. Chambers. The loss will fall heavily on all of them. Dr. Mathis' furniture and apparatus was totally lost.
