STEAMSHIP MARIPOSA BEING MUCH IMPROVED
 The Alaska Steamship company's liner Mariposa, is in dry dock receiving the finishing touches to extensive repairs and alterations. It is expected that the work will be completed within the next few days. Capt. Charles O'Brien, sticks very close to his favorite ship and proudly shows all visitors around and points out the changes. There has been a material change at the pilot house and bridge which has been raised until an unobstructed view can be obtained forward and over the bows. An upper cabin just abaft the pilot house has been created which will contain rooms for all the officers of the vessel. Some alterations to the main cabins provide extra state-rooms and altogether increases the first class cabin accommodations by 44, and all of the state rooms have been made more comfortable by making them two-berth rooms instead of three as many of them formerly were. Repairs to the hull are also being made by the underwriters. New plates near the keel and a part of the keel have been renewed. The metal where the paint has been scratched off looks bright as the day the ship was launched. The Mariposa will come off the dry dock practically as good as new and will be in fine trim to maintain her splendid record in Northern waters. She will resume the run to Southwestern Alaska via Juneau, sailing from Seattle January 20th.
