**TRUTH MUST BE TOLD ABOUT ALASKA**

Word comes from Washington that the government railroad project for Alaska will encounter strong opposition.

That was to be expected. Any thought that so important a measure, even with the support of the administration and the favorable recommendation of Senate and House committees, required only to be called up and go through the usual formalities of discussion to insure its passage was too optimistic by half.

Opposition was inevitable. It was bound to come. Alaska is so far removed from the base of legislative action, so wholly unknown to the East, that the opponents of the meritorious measure take liberties with facts at will and have recourse to all sorts of specious reasoning in lieu of honest, well-founded and well-informed arguments. And it is to meet and combat such opposition that a campaign of education is inaugurated at Washington by the Alaska bureau of the Seattle Chamber of Commerce. In this work of enlightenment and dissemination of truth every legitimate agency in this Pacific coast country should enlist itself actively, and at once.

What is being said against Alaska today was said against the entire country west of the Rocky mountains half a century and more ago. A great Massachusetts statesman once expressed the opinion that Uncle Sam's interest in his possessions westward would never extend beyond the Rockies—that the rest of the vast domain, now so rich and prosperous, and so big a part of the national domain, was not worth thinking about much less spending a cent of government money upon. How fantastical that shortsighted prophecy looks now! But it is quite in keeping with twentieth century talk today put forth by benighted newspapers like the Boston Herald that fail would have Congress believe Alaska a desolated waste—a territory worked out and in the last stages of decay—when, as a matter of fact, with its resources yet barely touched, it has already yielded hundreds of millions in wealth. This, too, in the face of the most difficult obstacles and with bureaucratic policies constantly killing the pioneer spirit in man and halting investments of capital at every turn.

The administration's railroad measure is an act of long-deferred justice—a measure of fair and square dealing of certain ultimate benefit to the United States as a whole. It is prompted by constructive statesmanship and supported by the logic of facts, and, once these facts are impressed upon Congress, certainly that body will find them irresistible and the bill will pass.—Seattle Post-Intelligencer.

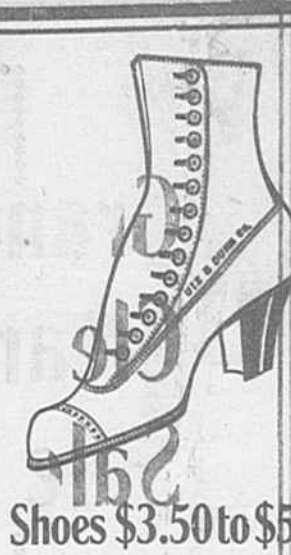
