**EVERETT OPTIMISTIC ON BUILDING OUTLOOK**  
 "The building outlook for Juneau during the coming season, looks favorable," said J. F. Everett, the well known architect who designed the Hotel Cain building for Jaeger and Ericson. "From the present indications I should say that the 1914 season will surpass the last. Another point that lends an optimistic tone to the future is that business men and property owners are beginning to realize the value of concrete construction from the view point of fire protection as well as other advantages and this means that there will be a better class of buildings erected in the future."  
 Several small capitalists living in the States, Mr. Everett says, have made inquiries as to the advisability of seeking investment in Juneau, and there is a possibility that some outside money may come this way for building purposes in the spring. Juneau, he says, has the opportunities for advantageous investment in this line, but it is so far away from the money centers that are seeking investment that its full recognition will not be realized at once.  
 Mr. Everett arrived on the Jefferson and took rooms at the Hotel Cain where he will remain until about January 18, when he will return Southward on business. He says that there has been a wonderful improvement in hotel accommodations since he came here last spring.
