DEFEAT OF GEORGE E. RYAN.

THE reported defeat of George E. Ryan for the United States marshalship in Western Washington and the appointment of another Tacoma man to a high office in that State will be depressingly disappointing to the Democratic party organization of Washington. Seattle with three times the population of Tacoma and more than four times the number of Democratic votes has not received as many offices since the change of administration as has the latter place. The excuse is offered that Seattle Democrats are divided and not working harmoniously. The fact of the matter is that those of Seattle who oppose the organization have not carried a primary within ten years and cannot do it in another ten. They do not elect enough delegates or precinct committeemen to make a convention or committee meeting in Seattle seem otherwise than a harmony love feast, yet, by using the social influence at the National capital of men who never lived in Seattle or King County, they have been able to catch the ear of those in high office.

No man in the State of Washington has done as much to perfect the organization that swept Gov. Ernest Lister into office and which came so near carrying the Evergreen State for Wilson as George Ryan has done. If the Democratic party shall elect a United States Senator in that State this year it will be because George Ryan and others who have worked at his side have kept the Democratic party true to progressive principles in spite of those who have secured most of the offices through the appointing powers.

However, George Ryan is a democrat—the little "d" is used purposely—who is such from principle and not for spoils. His strength will be even greater because he was refused the only political appointment he ever asked. The reactionaries will find him to be the same tireless and consummate organizer in the future that he has been in the past. He is still a leader and past master in the direction of energy in one of the most patriotic bands of progressive Democrats that ever organized for the public good—a band that will not permit misdirected officials of high rank to destroy the usefulness of the Democratic party in a sovereign State.

Congress resumes its work at the National capital today, and at the top of the calendar of both houses are the Alaska railroad bills. It is the consensus of Western opinion that Senators and Representatives cannot work too fast upon them. It is generally conceded that the administration bill will pass both houses as soon as a vote can be secured.

CHAMBERLAIN ABANDONS TARIFF FIGHT.

JOSEPH CHAMBERLAIN, prophet of the English high tariff element, has announced that he will never again run for Parliament, and practically admits that the cause for higher tariffs in England was lost for all time when the United States became a low tariff Nation.

The trend of British opinion seems to justify the reported conclusion of the aged British statesman. It is believed on the other side of the Atlantic that the new American tariff law will enable American manufacturers to produce cheaper and become competitors for the trade of the world in many things that have heretofore been monopolized by the British and Germans.

All of which is to say that when President Wilson referred to the "long generation through" fight for tariff reform in the United States as a continuous battle for the freedom of commerce he spoke from a store house of knowledge the discovery of the possession of which is causing all sorts and conditions of men in this country and the world to recognize in him a statesman of the first magnitude.
