WORTHY OF ENCOURAGEMENT.

THE plans of the Juneau high schools boys to make a tour of other towns of Southeastern Alaska and meet their basketball teams are worthy of encouragement.

ABOUT FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES.

THE fundamental principles of government involved in the controversy over the use of the streets of Juneau for mass meetings are the right of the public to their use for the purposes of traffic and the obligation of good citizens to obey the laws made by the majority or its legally constituted representatives.

However, in Juneau, there is an ordinance that prohibits the use of the streets for street meetings. The reasons assigned for the passage of the ordinance by the lawful representatives of the people, who have legal control of the streets, are that the thoroughfares of the city are narrow and that traffic is growing.

While that ordinance is in effect it is the law of the community, and good citizenship requires that its terms should be obeyed, just as all the other laws of the community should be obeyed.

So far as right principles are concerned, they are seldom on the side of law-breakers. They are not so in Juneau.

"RE-ADJUSTMENT"

"THE re-adjustment of business" is the President's phrase. Oil and tobacco have been re-adjusted and so has Union Pacific. About sixty civil and criminal proceedings against other monopolistic enterprises are pending.
