**GRAND JURY INDICTS GEORGE L. RICE**  
The grand jury this morning brought in an indictment against George L. Rice for the crime of maintaining a bawdyhouse or brothel from December 21, 1912, to January 20, 1914. The witnesses before the grand jury were Ed. J. Carlisle, George Sherburn, Kate Giovonelli, Ina Wallace, Anna Sterns, L. R. Smith, Leah Richards, and J. T. Martin. The indictment was returned as secret, but the defendant was apprehended and admitted to bail with William Burns and William Leyton as sureties in the sum of \$500 each.  
George L. Rice is a pioneer of Alaska. He came to Juneau more than 20 years ago, and was among the first to locate Skagway in 1897. He also operated a hotel at Bennett, before the White Pass terminals were removed to Whitehorse, and at Atlin. Later he returned to Juneau.
