MAYOR O'CONNOR RETURNS FROM TRIP TO SEATTLE

DOUGLAS, March 7.—Mayor of Douglas, M. J. O'Connor, arrived in the city this morning after an absence of a couple weeks in Seattle. Aside from his business transactions in the Sound cities, the Mayor informed a reporter of The Empire that he "helped to elect Hiram C. Gill for Mayor." Mr. O'Connor says that the election of Gill was not so much in consequence of Gill's fitness for the place as it was a protest against the "purty squad" and the Partisan policy of the former administration.

Mayor O'Connor will preside over the meeting of the city council which is called for Monday night, but says that nothing of importance will come up before the council, other than the routine business.

He says the Humboldt, since it installed its new oil burner, has increased its speed capacity, and that a very enjoyable trip was had on the way up.
