SAWMILL TO START WITHIN TWO WEEKS

DOUGLAS, March 9. — George E. James of the James sawmill is authority for the statement that the mill will be started for the summer season within ten days if there is no hitch in the present plans. Arriving on the Humboldt Saturday morning was the force of workmen who have charge of the operation of the mill and they will go on duty at once to prepare for the season's cut.

Among those returning were head sawyer, Bert Loomis, accompanied by Mrs. Loomis; Wm. Lindseott, who has charge of the carriage, accompanied by Mrs. Lindseott, together with a dozen workmen who constitute the crew.

Mr. James says that he expects to increase the output of the mill considerably this season, and has brought a large quantity of machinery for that purpose.
