**SEATTLE'S NEW OFFICERS' TERMS WILL BE SHORT**

The adoption of the commission form of government in Seattle last week and the election of a charter commission to formulate a new charter for the city, it is believed, will retire Mayor H. C. Gill and all the members of the present city government within six months. The charter commissioners are required to begin work within ten days after the election and submit their proposed new charter within 60 days. If the charter submitted is approved the old government will cease to exist.

One of the peculiar features of the election is that of the fifteen men elected to the charter commission nearly all of them are supporters of the Cotterill administration, and opposed Gill in the recent election. Former Mayor William Hickman Moore, who is associated in the public mind more closely with Mayor George F. Cotterill than any other man in the city, received 5,600 more votes for membership on the charter commission than any other candidate. Every candidate for a place on the commission that belonged to the old regime when Gill was in flower was defeated, not one of them receiving half as many votes as Judge Moore or Dr. J. H. Eagleson, who ran next to him and who is also a Cotterill supporter, received.

The following will constitute the charter commission:  
 William Hickman Moore, former mayor and lawyer; Dr. J. B. Eagleson, physician; A. V. Bouillon, former superintendent of public utilities; E. F. Blaine, a member of the State park board and for many years a member of the city park board; Thomas H. Bolton, president of the Central Labor Council; W. M. Calhoun, of the real estate firm of Calhoun, Denny and Ewing; Wm. Pitt Trimble, capitalist and business man; Dr. W. A. Major, formerly pastor of the Bethany Presbyterian church; O. B. Thorgirsson, lawyer and former assistant corporation counsel; Josiah Collins, a member of the State Senate; Thomas A. Lippy, capitalist; J. Y. C. Kellogg, lawyer; Charles W. Doyle, business agent of the Central Labor Council; Elmer E. Todd, lawyer and former United States district attorney, and C. J. Erickson, contractor.

**GLEANNINGS OF THE GREAT NORTHERN EMPIRE**

Jim Clinton and Al Dreese were caught in a snowslide when enroute from Seward to Nkik last month. Five others who were in the party and behind them dug them out. Both were unconscious and it required a half day to resuscitate them.

Justice John Ford of the Supreme Court of New York has written to Dr. J. A. Baughman, of Seward, game warden, making inquiries relative to the hunting of Kenai peninsula. He says he contemplates a hunting trip to Alaska next summer.

Mining will be active according to late reports next summer in the Turnagain arm country. The Mathelson Mining company has cut 300,000 feet of lumber with which to build flumes to carry water to its hydraulic plant and do other things about its plant. N. O. Anderson, also a Turnagain arm operator, will work his property this year. He already is on the ground.

Bear creek and Little Indian creek, in the Hope country, near Seward, will be worked this year. Bear creek was worked about ten years ago, and stopped. Prospectors located the pay streak last summer and this year they will operate. Little Indian creek was staked 12 years ago, but never prospected until last summer when the indications were so favorable that it was decided to work it this year.

The passage of the Alaska railroad bill resulted in the formation of a brass band at Cordova. Musicians in the town got their horns and other instruments out to celebrate the occasion and the discovery was made that they had enough material for a good organization, which was subsequently formed.

The Cordova Alaskan says freight is being delivered from McCarthy to Chitana at 1 1/2 cents a pound.

The accumulated delinquent tax list at Fairbanks for the last eight years amount to \$19,685.76. An effort is to be made to force payments.

Tanana Valley residents have been given until April 1st to make returns under the income tax law.

So confident are the residents of Richardson, on the Tanana, that their town will be on the main line of the trunk road from Chitina to Fairbanks that they have already set aside ground for a station.
