GOV. LISTER, of Washington, has injected a new idea into the discussion concerning the repeal of the Panama free tolls provision.

The suggestions of Gov. Lister are worthy of more than passing notice. The same causes that have operated to force American shipping out of foreign commerce would operate to give Canadians an advantage over Americans in shipping from ocean to ocean through the Panama canal.

The declaration of the head of the house of Guggenheim in favor of the government ownership of railroads, telegraphs and telephones was a cruel pronouncement just now when Pinchot is about to launch his Pennsylvania campaign. It will necessitate a delay in New Nationalism activities until a new scare-crow can be manufactured.

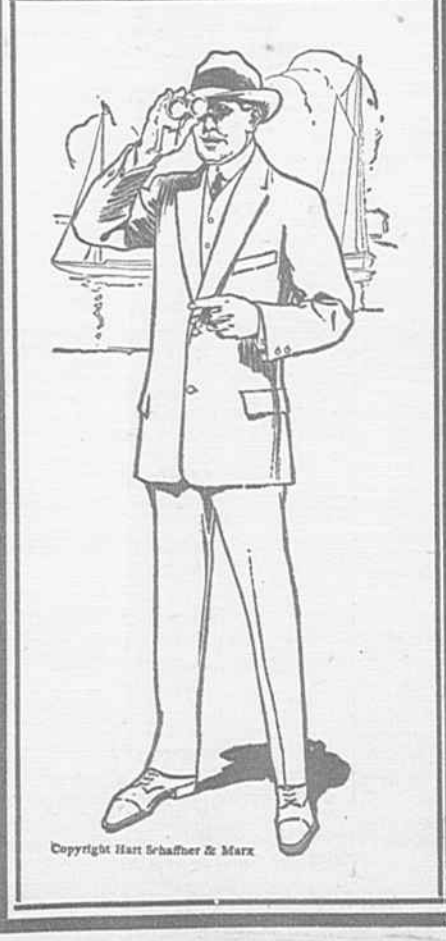
