DEMOCRATS ASK REMOVAL OF RUSTGARD AND FAULKNER

(Continued from Page One.)

Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States, and all of the heads of the different departments of our National government, and their administration of the laws of the Nation, and

WHEREAS, it is the sense of the members of this club, who are familiar with the situation in Alaska, politically and otherwise, that in order to effectually carry out the policies and principles of our National administration in detail, and to the end that harmony shall prevail between the heads of different departments representing the government in Alaska, and for the just administration of the law and for the good of the service, it is essential that all the principal offices in Alaska be filled by good and trust-worthy Democrats, and

WHEREAS, since the passage and adoption of the resolutions of the third day of October, 1913, it has more completely and generally been demonstrated by the actions of John Rustgard, United States District Attorney for the First Judicial Division of Alaska, at Juneau, and H. L. Faulkner, the United States Marshal for said Judicial Division, that there is such ill-feeling and friction existing between the two said officers that even under a Republican administration it would be better to have both of said officers resign their respective positions or be removed therefrom, and

It also further appears that the acts and actions of the said John Rustgard in dealing with matters that have come before him officially are intentionally such as are calculated to block and defeat the just administration of the law and bring discredit upon the Democratic party in Alaska:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the members of the Juneau Democratic Club of Juneau, Alaska, that it is to the best interests of the Democratic party and for the preservation of its principles and maintenance of harmony and for the just administration of the law and for the good of the service, that John Rustgard, United States District Attorney, of the First Judicial Division of Alaska, as well as H. L. Faulkner, United States Marshal of said division, be at once removed from office or their resignation demanded; and that the appointing power adhere to the Democratic National platform, and especially to that plank therein that provides: "We demand for the people of Alaska the full enjoyment of the rights and privileges of a Territorial form of government, and we believe that the officials appointed to administer the government of all our Territories and the District of Columbia should be qualified by previous bona fide residence." That Alaska Democrats of good standing and ability be appointed to succeed said United States District Attorney and said United States Marshal respectively for said First Judicial Division of Alaska; and we respectfully protest against the recent appointment of non-residents of Alaska to Federal positions in Alaska.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of this Club forward copies of these resolutions to the President of each and every Democratic Club or Democratic organization within the Territory of Alaska, and that they be urged to pass resolutions respecting the removal of all hold-over Republican appointees within their respective judicial divisions; and that copies be mailed and forwarded to the President of the United States, to the United States Attorney-General, to the Secretary of the Interior, to the Secretary of the Treasury and to the Postmaster General at Washington, D. C.
