EVERY MOVEMENT INTERESTING AT FIREMEN'S SMOKER.
TREADWELL, April 1.—The Treadwell Firemen gave one of the snappiest entertainments last night which has been seen on the island for many years. Perhaps never before in the history of the organization have things moved along so fraught with unabated excitement from the moment when the orchestra started the performance at 8:15 to the time of closing at 10:30.
After the orchestra, came Monte Snow, who sang, then followed the tumbling class, under the direction of Tom McDonald. Two big men hereupon entered the ring and struggled like gladiators in an ancient Roman amphitheatre. They pulled and tugged for ten minutes to a draw; these wrestlers were Pat O'Connor of Juneau, and Hoffard, of Treadwell. Then followed a song by Tom Gillies, with Chas. Close accompanying him on the piano. These entertainers were encored and had to sing two more songs. The applause had scarcely died away when Hutton and Grundler, middleweights, went three snappy rounds in which they showed a total disregard of the feelings of each other. Jack Wilson and Tom Kingsley, was acted as Judges could not determine which was the better man, so the highweights went on for another spurt, and the referee then decided that Grundler had a slight edge over his opponent so he was given the decision.
Practically the same thing happened to Beals and Jim McDonald. They lambasted each other for three rounds and breaking about even, were requested to go to it again, and then the referee had to decide in favor of Beals.
Strange to say, the judges could not decide who was the better man when Kerkes and Goebel went on for three rounds of intense boxing, and for the third time the referee had to decide the contest which went to Goebel.
Right here followed some scientific boxing which was not on the program—Wah, a Chinaman from aboard the Admiral Evans, now in the harbor at Juneau, and a soldier from Fort Seward named Hootes, each of them men of experience and activity fought to the delight of the audience, giving a pretty exhibition of the noble art of self defense. No decision was rendered in their case, but they were highly complimented.
Gillies, with Chas. Close accompanying him, followed with two vocal solos, and then another three-round boxing contest came off. Ed. Harris, of the Mexican and Ed. Olson of Treadwell went to it for home and native land. At the end of their contest, it was hard to decide which was the victor, but as Olsen had received a gory cut over the optic, the decision was given to Harris.
The wind-up, and it was some wind-up, rest assured of that, the two middleweights, Gross and DeMontzon, experienced and battle-scarred veterans, of the ring, went out after each other's scalp, and each of them lost some hair in the fray. They were cheered on to victory by a wildly enthusiastic audience which filled the hall and galleries. Again the judges were undecided, and the house rules required that another bout be pulled off to decide the championship, but DeMontzon was too tired to make further battle for honors, and so let the decision go to Gross without further struggle.
