### CHARGES NOT TRUE

A WEEK ago yesterday the candidates on the Peoples' party ticket promulgated a municipal platform which charged the members of the present city council, in direct terms or by plain inference, with crimes involving their official rectitude and personal character. The platform stated as the last proposition that those who made it were "ready and able to present evidence of time, dates, circumstances and parties present" to substantiate the charges that were made in general terms.

One week ago today The Empire demanded in the name of its readers who are voters in Juneau that the proof which the Peoples' party candidates announced that they possessed be presented. It said until that was presented they could not have any standing before the people of this city in any light but that of character assassins. The demand for the proof was repeated on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. A representative of the paper called upon Mr. Valentine, who heads the Peoples' party ticket, and asked for the evidence that it might be presented to the people.

Only one business day now intervenes before election day, and those who boasted that they could prove that the members of the old city council were crooks and knaves have been as silent as the grave. What is the reasonable inference?

THE CHARGES ARE FALSE! The members of Juneau's municipal government and the candidates on the Citizens' ticket were slandered. Their slanderers should be defeated.

### CITIZENS' TICKET RECOGNIZES WELL ESTABLISHED PRINCIPLE

THE POLICY of not making a complete change in the personnel of town and city councils at one time has become so universally recognized that it is provided against by law in most of the States. In practically every State in the Nation only a part of the city council is chosen at each election. In many of them a majority holds over. For instance, in Seattle where they have nine councilmen, three are chosen each year for three-year terms. In the third class municipalities of Washington—towns of from 1500 to 8000 population—three of the seven members hold over from one election to the next, the rule being to elect three councilmen each year for two years and one for one year, making the councilmanic membership seven, the same as in Alaska. This same policy is recognized in most of the State governments. Dele-

gate Wickersham gave his approval when he prepared the organic act for Alaska, and Congress endorsed it when it passed that act which provides that half of the Senators shall hold over. In making up the Citizens' ticket this well established business policy was recognized. A minority of the members of the present city council—Mayor Charles W. Carter, William H. Case and William S. Geddes—who have given the city excellent service during the last year, were placed on the ticket, and with them, constituting a majority of the ticket, were nominated four public spirited, able and experienced men of affairs—John Reck, William Britt, John R. Willis and C. W. Fries.

There is not a man on the ticket who has not made good, measure him by what standard you will. They are—every one of them—men who are used to bearing responsibility of a public nature as well as having been successful in their own affairs.

### SPECIAL REASONS FOR JUNEAU

THERE are special reasons why good business demands that there should not be a complete change in the city council of Juneau. This city is growing and developing at a rapid rate, and it is essential that municipal development shall keep up with it. The new council will come into power at the season of the year when plans for the year's work must be made quickly and their execution begun almost immediately. To meet this situation there should be some members of the present council who are familiar with the details of the city's affairs retained on the next.

That desired end may be attained by voting for the Citizens' ticket, a minority of which is made up from the present council.

### HARRY MALONE

ALL OF Southeastern Alaska mourns the death of Harry Malone. He had resided in this section of Alaska for a decade and a half. His acquaintance extended along the coast from Ketchikan far to the Westward, and all who knew him liked him and called him friend. He possessed those qualities of character and temperament that make friends and holds them in a remarkable degree. And he was a good citizen. As agent for others, as a business man, as a public official and as a man among men he always made good. He will be missed as few in this country will be when their time shall come to answer the last summons. The wife and children of Juneau's dead at Seattle have the sympathy of everybody that knew Harry Malone.
