WHOLESALE ATTITUDE.

MR. VALENTINE'S commendation of Juneau's new City Council and his advice to the people to be "reasonable and generous" with it, presents the leader of the late opposition in a light that is altogether favorable. His wholesome attitude is in keeping with the requirements of the situation. To get the best results for this city people must work together, and there is no place where they can begin that offers better opportunity than the municipal government. Big things are going on in this community, and the citizens should meet them in a large way. If all of us would follow the suggestion that Mr. Valentine makes, as to the proper attitude toward the City Council, in all community matters a Juneau spirit would result that would go far in the development of the city and Territory.

Tanner here of privilege of guessing again. It would be a pity to take snap judgment on them. Skagway's grim, old, fighting warrior will not become a "dead one" that easy.

GEN. VILLA.

GEN. VILLA'S defeat of the Federals at Torreón, following so closely upon his victory at Ojinaga and previous successes, stamps his easily as the main dependence of

those who seek to unhorse Huerta in Mexico. He is the one among them all who understands best that armed revolutions cannot be made successfully without defeating the armies of the government, and that that requires fighting. He has left the proclamations and the banquets and the society functions to others, while he has persistently pursued the enemy with his men. And in his performance of his conception of his work he has shown that he possesses military capacity of a high order. He has done little or no bluffing, but he has fought with the dogged determination that has characterized the great captains of other days and other countries. If the Constitutionalists had a man who could act the part of a statesman as well as Gen. Villa acts that of a warrior, the Mexican situation would be more hopeful.

The quiet enthusiasm that prevailed at the meetings of the Presbytery of Alaska in this city was more than justified by the reports of the wonderful work that is being done among the Indians of the North by that energetic church. In the after while, when the Indians shall have become capable citizens, there will be none but who will recognize the extent of the great service that the Presbyterian and other churches are rendering in Alaska.

After all, Mayor O'Connor seems to be the one that is entitled to most congratulations. The others had to fight for their victories—and some of them did not get victories after fighting.
