A PARALLEL IN FREE TOLLS.

THOSE people who think they see a surrender to Great Britain in the free tolls repeal policy of the administration never refer to the controversy between the United States on the one side and Great Britain and Canada on the other over the Welland canal.

The Welland canal was built by Canada through Canadian soil around Niagara Falls, and it affords the only means of direct navigation between the Great Lakes above Niagara and Lake Ontario, the St. Lawrence river and the Atlantic ocean below it.

These labor unions that are contributing money to arm the strikers in Colorado's coal and iron mining district are not advancing the cause of laboring men. They are injuring it.

DISARMAMENT IN COLORADO.

WHEN Colorado goes into the disarming business in the strike district it should go all the way. Not only should the arms be taken from the strikers, but they should be taken from the hired "killers" in the employ of mine owners.

The very strength of the United States, with its wealth, its navy and its fortified canal, precludes the possibility of criticism for weakness if we repeal the free tolls provision in response to the protests of the Nations.
