When the milkman failed to arouse him this morning at nine o'clock, he became suspicious that something was wrong and called the assistance of Marshal Shafer and Mayor O'Connor, who visited the room and found the old man dead. Mayor O'Connor caused the personal effects of the deceased to be examined and found money in his purse to the amount of \$19.75, together with a postal money order for three dollars payable to H. Floyd, tax collector at St. Augustine, Fla. Letters from a sister in Hassendel, Prussia, were also found and some addresses of people in the old country were among his papers.

Mayor O'Connor has taken charge of the affairs of the dead man and the burial will take place tomorrow. His relatives will be communicated with at once and an endeavor made to find his heirs. Paletto was a person of considerable means, owning a number of houses in Douglas.

Mr. Paletto remarked yesterday afternoon that he was not feeling well, but he had been on the streets during the early evening and there was no apparent indication of the ailment which caused his death.


