The captain, called "Wolf" Larsen in the story, was named Hansen, and although he was a Dane, was known around here as the "Flying Dutchman" and was said to be a smuggler in the early days.
To those who have read the book the picture will carry a special interest and the knowledge that it is a picture of practically local scenes, should attract everyone.

AMERICAN PEOPLE SUPPORT ADMINISTRATION
At last, it seems, Victoriano Huerta is leaving Mexico.
It is for Mexico's good that he leaves.
And the triumph of "amateur altruism" seems to be complete.
Sneers and malicious mocking, the pressure of prestige and the power of property have not served to deflect the course of an American administration in a trying situation. American principles have been applied in a foreign land as they would have been applied at home and the world has been compelled to accept them.
Expediency has been held insufficient ground for recognizing government by assassination.
All the elaborate arguments in the name of diplomacy, international relationships and such rot have not swayed the American public from the belief that this nation is no required to recognize a cold-blooded murderer as the president of a neighboring republic—particularly in the face of the fact that the people of that republic do not want him for their President.
The U. S. Department of State in refusing to join European nations in their recognition of Huerta knew that the American people would support the refusal, once the situation was understood. And in spite of elaborate efforts of misrepresentations and in spite of elaborate efforts to beloud the issue, the American people quickly came to understand.
So supporters of the Mexican murderer found it was not merely the policy of President Wilson and Secretary Bryan they were arguing against, but the deep, earnest conviction of the American people.
The end reached today was inevitable.—Seattle Sun.
