## SEATTLE BUSINESS MAN IS ENCOURAGED

William Pigott, president of the Seattle Car & Foundry company and vice-president of the Pacific Coast Steel company, believes President Woodrow Wilson will carry out his "anti-trust" legislative program, with certain amendments which Congress is likely to place in the administration bills and that business will be better. He returned last night from an extended business trip to the East, where he made a careful study of conditions, thereby ascertaining, he said this morning, that Seattle's position is a very happy and fortunate one and that the Pacific Coast is due for a big revival of trade, commerce and industrial development.

"The administration regulatory trade and trust bill will be passed, perhaps not as first drawn, and it will be well that these matters are finally disposed of now," said Mr. Pigott. "Personally, I have determined, after making a careful scrutiny of business and business men—the manufacturers and public sentiment in the East, that investors of the country—are not so much afraid of the progressive legislator in Republican, in Democratic or in Progressive ranks, as he is in fear of the professional politician who advocates extreme radicalism and stirs up false issues for the sole and selfish purpose of grabbing an office."—Seattle Times.

## DAWSON MAKES UNDERSIRABLES WALK

Dawson is conducting a campaign against undesirable residents. Those who are found to be of the unwanted class who are subject to deportation are being "blueticketed" out of the country.

The Dawson News of July 17 says: "Two of the ten men who were rounded up the first of the week and taken before E. E. Stockton, immigration inspector, on the ground that they were undesirable, have been blueticketed. They were found to be aliens, and, after a careful examination, were told that their presence here no longer was required. They were informed of the time of the departure of the next steamer, and are understood to have taken the track for another country."

"The others who were up for examination were not all found of the most desirable stripe, but some asserted they are Canadian citizens, and in that event cannot be deported. They are being watched, and so long as they walk the straight and narrow path are exempt from arrest on any specific charge, but the police say that while the matter of citizenship is being looked up carefully, the movements of any under suspicion also are being watched carefully."

### Newspaper Approves.

Commenting upon the action of the immigration inspector the Dawson News says:

"The action taken by Immigration Inspector Stockton to rid the city of undesirable is to be commended. He should, and doubtless will, receive the support of all the law-abiding citizens of the community. Many business men spoke yesterday in praise of the step, and were emphatic in the pronouncement that the city ill can afford to have their ilk sojourning here."

"The tinhorn and surething gambler and his stripe are a detriment to every line of legitimate business and enterprise of the community. Business houses find that such undesirable get away with the hard-earned cash of wage-earners and that as a consequence bills are not paid, and the injury is felt all along the line."

"When it becomes known in other cities that Dawson is making short shrift of the sharks, the town will have little more trouble on the old score."

## STANDARD OIL PLANT TO BE FINISHED AUG. 15

Great progress is being made on the Standard Oil company's storage depot just South of Juneau and it is now believed that the work will be complete by August 15.

The pile driving for the dock has just been completed and the preliminary work on the foundations for the big storage tanks is well advanced. The warehouses and cottages for the help that will be employed are also progressing satisfactorily.

## W. J. BRYAN ON THE COLOMBIAN AWARD

We believe that thinking people in the United States as a whole deplore the disposition to drag the question of compensation to the republic of Colombia for such losses as it sustained through the separation of Panama into partisan politics. The belief or conviction that Colombia is justly entitled to reparation at the hands of her powerful neighbor is, to say the least, widespread. The fact that Colombia did not, from the Washington viewpoint of the period, exhibit expected or demanded friendliness in the negotiations preliminary to the uprising of Panama and the establishment in that province of an independent republic, has practically no bearing upon the equities in the proposed scheme of settlement. And it cannot be denied that Colombia has suffered great loss both in money and national prestige through acts for which the United States does not wish to shirk direct responsibility.

Mr. Bryan holds that the proposed payment to Colombia of \$25,000,000 will only partly compensate her for the financial loss she has sustained; those who disagree with him, while confessing that something is due, decline to say how much. Colombia is prepared to go into a court of arbitration for the establishment of her claim. "Our nation," says the Secretary of State, "being much the larger nation and having refused to arbitrate, takes upon itself the responsibility of doing justice to Colombia." And he adds forcibly: "Not only is it our duty to do justice to Colombia, but in case of doubt as to what is just, we must resolve that doubt against ourselves and in favor of Colombia." The sum involved is large, it is true, but the debt it is intended to pay is great. Because it is realized by the government at Washington as a debt that cannot be wiped out by money alone, regret is offered as part of the reparation, and this has been hotly denounced as a confession of wrong-doing, as an act of uncalled-for national humility.

We do not feel that this is in any sense a personal or a partisan matter. Rather the government at Washington, representative of the people of the United States, must be regarded in this matter as far above all personality and partisanship. It cannot afford to be less than just, less than generous, or less than frank in its dealings with Colombia. It does not humiliate, it dignifies itself, by refusing to treat a small nation with less consideration than it would grant a great one.—Christian Science Monitor.
