**McBRIDE PARTY KILL  
RARE ANIMAL AND LOSE IT**

The J. C. McBride hunting expedition returned to Juneau at a late hour last night after an absence of nine days. Members of the party report the most remarkable experience—having the good luck of sighting and killing a magnificent specimen of the bovinofollis they were unfortunate enough to shoot the animal on the edge of a high cliff and the carcass tumbled to the lowest depth of a ravine from which it could not be taken or even reached. All are united in saying that the animal was of enormous size and the first they had ever seen. Aside from this disappointment they had a fine time. McBride and Waldron early in the game commenced taking salt water baths and kept up the practice from force of circumstances and feel equal to most anything now.

They killed an enormous quantity of small game but were out so long that they ate up everything except three deer, five dozen ducks, and two geese.

They left here on the launch Lillian and returned on the same craft. The party was composed of the following: J. C. McBride, W. W. Waldron, William Frye, Len. Adelt, R. W. Wulsen, and Capt. C. C. McCoanaghy. Frye killed the bovinofollis.
