Movie 'Ice Palace' Here Wednesday Depicts Alaska Struggle For Statehood

"Ice Palace," Edna Ferber's story of Alaska's struggle for statehood, brought to the screen by Warner Bros., comes to Kodiak next week, beginning Wednesday, August 3, and continuing through August 6.

The story deals with the taming of Alaska and the struggle of this great northern wilderness to become America's 49th state. It is said to be a powerful, exciting and authentic saga of a young country coming of age.

The story of the march to statehood by the last great American frontier is told in the half-century-long struggle of the two Titans. The Titans are Richard Burton, who, as Zeb "Czar" Kennedy, wants to take everything from the country and give nothing, and Robert Ryan as Thor Storm, of Norwegian heritage, whose love for Alaska rouses him to battle for statehood its people want.

NATIONAL FOUNDATION OFFERS SCHOLARSHIPS

At least five students from Alaska may become the state's recipients of The National Foundation's 1960 Health Scholarships.

Four year scholarships are offered by the March of Dimes organization, in the health fields of medicine, nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy and medical social work. The scholarships pay \$500 a year or \$2,000 for four years.

Candidates for nursing, physical therapy and occupational therapy must be graduating high school seniors. In medicine and medical social work, scholarships will go to students already in college. At least 515 scholarships are awarded throughout the country.

Selection will be based on scholastic achievement, financial need, personal aptitude and professional promise. The scholarship money may be used to cover any appropriate student expense.

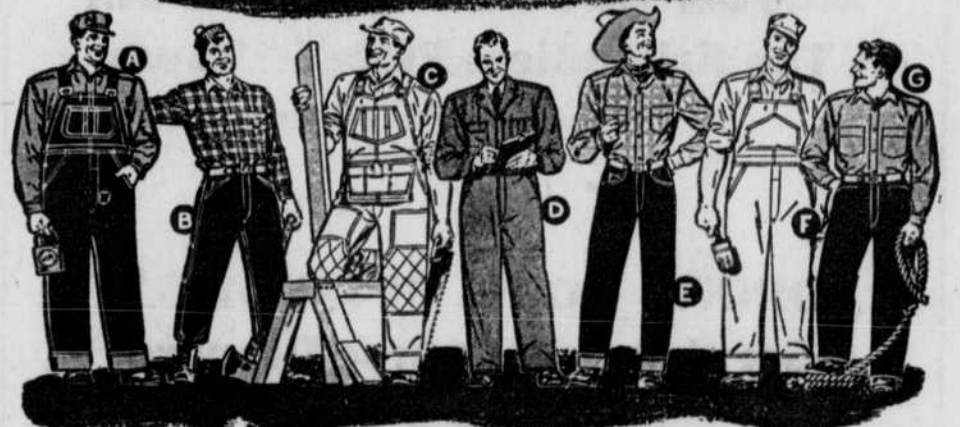
