

## School Registration Begins August 29

The On-Base high school students will be enrolled in the Kodiak city schools Monday, August 29, beginning at 9:30 a.m., according to an announcement this week by Superintendent of Schools Ivor Schott.

The school bus will make its regular run beginning the first stop at the Hobby Shop at 8:30. The bus will return to the Base just as soon as enrollment is completed.

Both high school and elementary school pupils living in Kodiak will enroll on Tuesday, August 30, beginning at 9 o'clock and continuing through 12 noon, then from 1 until 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

Any child who is six years of age or who will become six years of age on or before the first day of November next following the beginning of the school year shall be considered a child of school age. A child who shall be five

years of age on or before the first day of November next following the beginning of the school year may enroll in kindergarten. All kindergarten and first grade pupils must bring either birth certificates or some other legal proofs of their ages with them when they enroll, according to Schott.

## 177 Benefit Here From Soc. Security

At the end of 1959 as Federal Social Security was starting its twenty-fifth year, old-age, survivors, and disability insurance monthly benefits were being paid in the Kodiak Island area to 177 persons at the rate of \$9,563 per month, according to figures released today by E. C. Cummins, manager of the Juneau social security district office.

"For the entire State of Alaska, social security payments were being paid at the rate of \$328,000 per month, an increase of about 7 per cent since February 1959, the last previous date for which area figures are available," he said. Altogether, benefits totaling \$4,090,000 were paid out under the program in Alaska in 1959.
