

Tickets On Sale For Music Trails

The sale of season tickets for the 1960-61 Alaska Music Trail's music presentations is now under way. For the fourth consecutive year, the Kodiak Business and Professional Women will sponsor the series of concerts in Kodiak. Mrs. A. Holmes Johnson has been named business manager with Mrs. Arthur Brooks as ticket chairman. The Alaska Music Trail is a co-operative, non-profit project which came into being while Alaska was still a Territory. Organized and directed by a group of fifteen communities, its aim is to bring fine music, performed by artists of national and international fame, to every community in the North.

An especially talented and varied group of artists will make their appearance here. The fall season will bring Richard Dyer-Bennet, America's beloved folk singer in October; and in November, Regis Pasquier, 14-year-old French violin prodigy. The spring portion of the program will introduce to Kodiak, Michi North, gifted Alaskan pianist, in February, with Nan Merriman, world famous mezzo-soprano, appearing in April.

Said to be the supreme achievement in the wondrous art of animation and the Disney method of cinematic story telling, the film represents his greatest undertaking in entertainment. Some 300 artists worked on it through six years.

Other fascinating individual characters are Maleficent, the witch-queen of Evil, and her brood of sub-human orderlies; and the three Good Fairies, Flora, Fauna and Merryweather.

POLICE ARRESTS MADE
