given only a few things with which to improvise. They built their own igloos, fished through the ice, shot ptarmigan, and snared rabbits with snares they had to make themselves. One night at 3 a.m. one wall of the igloo collapsed and Joe had to get up and build it all over again."

Mrs. Stanton told us that she was born in Winthrop, Massachusetts, attended boarding school where she learned to be organized and that this is what saves life with five children from becoming utter chaos. Her father is the famous restaurateur, Jack Larkin, of the Red Coach Grills in the East.

"That was fun in college; I took my whole gang from school in for meals on the house. The managers hated to see me coming because we ate up the profits. There are days here when I think how heavenly it would be to march all seven of us into one of Daddy's restaurants and drive the manager wild. But I would really rather be in Kodiak. I love it here. When Joe got orders to Kodiak I asked him whose toes he had stepped on to get a place like this. Now I wonder who his friend was in Washington who sent him here. The fishing thrills me; I grew up

fishing on Cape Cod but it was nothing like this. I like downtown Kodiak because the tradespeople are all so friendly and ready to go out of their way to be helpful. I think of it as a resort town; it is like one with its quaint, narrow streets and its friendly people."

Hy Stanton's enthusiasm sparks everything she does, and is a tonic to anyone who has the good fortune to know her. She paints and sketches, fishes, cans and smokes salmon, works hard for the PTA, the Coast Guard Officers' Wives Club and other organizations, and manages her large family with good humor and efficiency.

She continued, "About once a day I look around and say to myself, This Is Alaska! I'm really in Alaska. This island is so wonderful with all these beautiful mountains. They remind me of the first four lines of a poem:

I know not where God's islands lift

Their fronded palms in air,  
I only know I cannot drift  
Beyond his love and care."

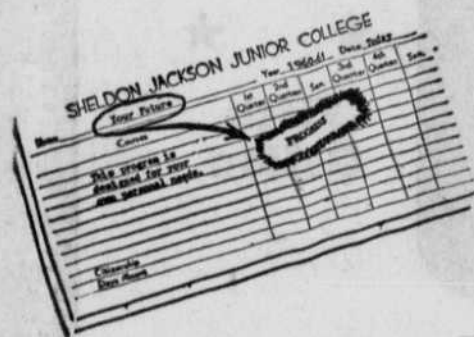

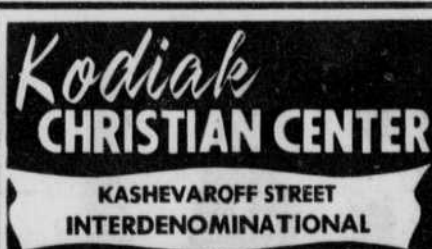
