

'King Crab Story' Shown at Rotary

The King Crab Story in a movie was the main feature of the program at the Rotary Club luncheon held at the 49 Room Tuesday.

The half-hour movie depicting the catching and processing of king crab in the Kodiak Island area was lauded by all those who saw it as a true picture of this important industry in Kodiak, and was pronounced interesting, informative and a highly skilled 'take' of the fishery. Filmed by Amos Berg with the commentary supplied by Roy Rickey, the movie provided closeups of the crab in the molting season as they shed their shells, and of the young crab as they walked the oceans bottom; it gave first hand views of the fishermen, their boats and gear as they lifted huge nets and pots laden with the giant crustaceans, and the turbulent seas on which they worked. The final processing, as the crab were landed at the cannery, cooked, canned, frozen, and packaged for shipment both by boat and plane.

Scenes familiar to Kodiakans were arial shots of Kodiak, downtown banner-bedecked streets and gay crowds as Kodiak celebrated the King Crab Festival.

The movie was the result of a cooperative effort by merchants, canneries, and the Chamber of Commerce, who contributed to the cost. Roy Rickey, head of the ADFG office here, spearheaded the project and arranged for its filming.

Cdr. Dick Stacer was received into membership by Art Brooks, president of the Club.

Guests attending were Bud Duhamil, and Rotary student member Bob Richmond.

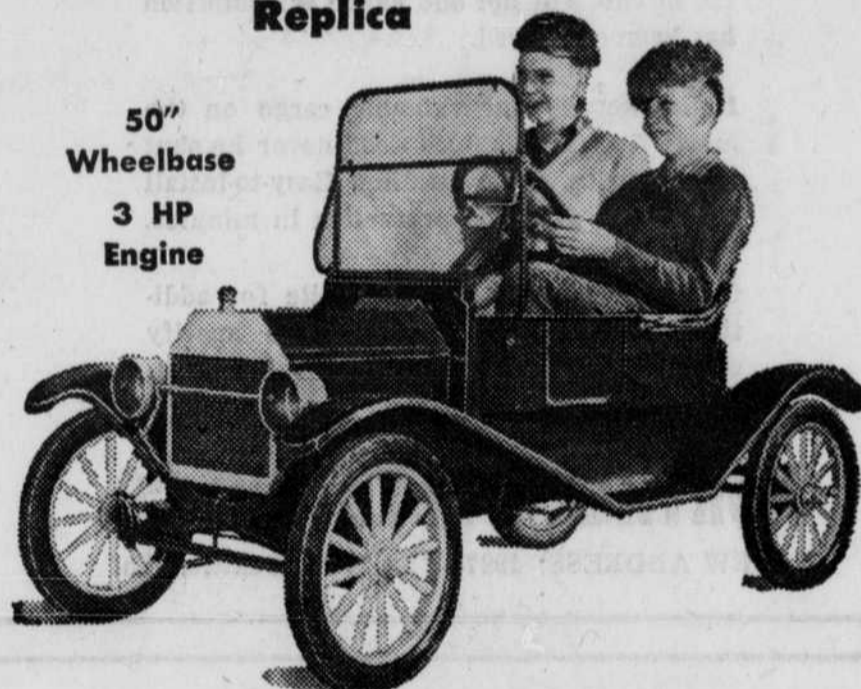
