don, but they are gone. I hope to dig up a little of this literary dust myself before I'm transferred elsewhere or decide to chance retirement.

"I would like to set down in black and white my indebtedness to the three people in particular who have influenced me most and who showed me the way to writing for profit. There was, first of all, the late Captain Walter Karig, who supervised the writing of the Navy's classic Battle Reports, books that reported the different phases of World War II, and later, the Korean War. Captain Karig put me on the trail of some of my first published articles. Then there is Captain Allan R. Bosworth about whom I talked earlier, a Navy Public Relations man who can turn a phrase like few men I have known. Although throughout the years I was to know 'Captain Boz' he was never to see the things I

wrote until after they appeared in print, his indirect advice was to have a great effect on the things I later wrote. This indirect advice was there to learn from every time he sat down and talked about writing problems he had faced at different times, and how he had resolved them.

"The third greatest influence was another Naval officer, a four striper named William J. Lederer, who gained considerable fame when he collaborated with Eugene Burdick in writing the novel, *The Ugly American*.

"I met them all, for the first time, soon after I reported for duty on the staff of *All Hands* in 1948. Each man, in his own way, helped me immeasurably."

The first major story the Navy free-lancer ever sold was to *This Week Magazine*, a Sunday supplement carried by newspapers throughout the United States. It was a two page article on the rotation of a Marine replacement draftee during the Korean War.

This was in 1950. After that there were others, interspersed with 'quickies' for the pulps.

The chief added to the advice already given to prospective writers, "A writer must be all things to all people, kind, sympathetic, but to become a really good writer, to turn out prose designed for immortality, he must be willing to do anything, use anything, even to destroy and be ruthless, if he is to achieve the thing he values most."
