## Council Took Up Leaking In New School Gym

Lack of a quorum Monday night held up the convening of the city council for nearly half an hour, and finally the Chief of Police was dispatched for Councilman O'Connor. However, he put in his appearance about ten minutes later, not having seen the Chief, who looked in later to discover the missing councilman was present.

The reading of the minutes was dispensed with by motion and bills were read, approved and ordered paid.

A report was received from a special committee appointed to investigate the condition of the roof of the gymnasium of the new school building and determine the causing of considerable water dripping through on to the floor of the gym. The committee consisted of H. F. Paterson, Duffy O'Connor and Robert E. Lyle. Their report declared that condensation was the cause and not that the roof itself leaked. The report recommended battening over all seams in the gym ceiling to prevent the heat from the building getting into the attic, thereby eliminating the cause of the condensation of frost which forms when extremely cold weather is experienced. The council discussed the problem for some time, President of the School Board, Almer Rydeen taking part in the discussion. The council then voted approval of work to batten up the seams.

A copy of a letter to Attorney General Truitt of the Territory of Alaska from Harry Saito was read, which requested the attorney general to take up the matter of the refusal of the Nome city council to grant approval to an

application which he had made for a restaurant liquor license. The letter went into many alleged injustices and points of policy in which the city council was charged with not being fair in denying him approval. The letter also stated Saito was going to take up the matter with the Japanese Consul in Seattle, who was to be requested to take it up with the Japanese Ambassador in Washington, D. C.

A letter from the Bandon, Oregon Fire Department was read which asked the Chief of the Nome Fire Department to pass the hat, obtain some monetary contributions and forward to Bandon, Oregon, to help the department there build a shelter for its equipment. The letter re-

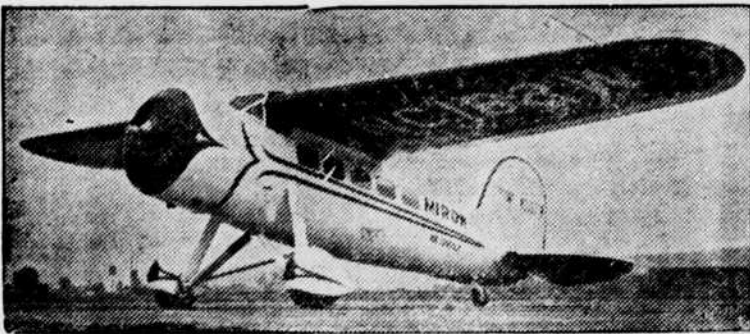
