## Weather Today

Snow storms were observed this morning at Golovin, Council and eastward to Nulato and south ward to Bethel. Generally fair weather continues over the eastern section of the Nome-Fairbanks Airway. Rain was falling along the Aleutians while generally cloudy weather prevails over southeastern Alaska.

Low barometric pressure covers Alaska and the Bering Sea with the lowest readings near St. Paul, Island, Alaska. It is likely that cloudy and unsettled weather with snow squalls and fog will prevail for Nome and Vicinity tonight and Friday.

Temperatures were higher last night over interior and western Alaska and were lower over northern Alaska. changes were not important in other sections.

The lowest Nome temperature last night was -10 at 11:30 p.m., and the highest yesterday 16 above. About 42 inches of snow remain on the ground.

The place of meetings has not yet been decided, but will be announced tomorrow.


