Weather Today  
(U S. Weather Bureau)

Low pressure continues over the southern Alaska coast and north Pacific ocean accompanied by unsettled weather and heavy falls of rain and snow in that area. 1.60 inch moisture was reported from Cordova and 1.44 in. from Juneau. A ridge of high pressure extends from northwest ern Canada south along the lea of the Rockies to the northern Great Plains in the States, resulting in fair, cold weather thruout that area. The lowest temperature reported is 20 below at Cop-permine. The lowest Nome temperature last night was 28 degrees above and the highest yesterday was 36 degrees above. The precipitation was 0.03 inch in 1/2 in of snow.

Mirow Soon To  
Fly To States On  
Coastal Route

Leaving in a day or two on a combined vacation and business trip to the States by plane, Pilot-manager Hans Mirow of the Mirow Air Service plans on making an extended tour touching Pacific Coast cities and as far East as Washington, D.C.

Mrs. Mirow and daughter Ann, are expected to accompany him, in addition to a couple of passengers.

He will fly the amphibian plane of the Mirow Air Service to Fairbanks thence via coastal points, touching at Juneau and Ketchikan, to Seattle.

In response to an invitation by the Seattle Chamber of Commerce, his flight down the "Pan-handle" of Alaska will be in the nature of a semi-survey of a possible air mail route, which North west Pacific aviation circles are endeavoring to have approved.

Pilot Mirow has made the interior flight through British Columbia to Seattle and return, several times. This trip will be one of his first commercial flights through Southeastern Alaska. He expects to be gone about three months.

RETURN FROM ALASKA

When the Alaska Game Commission's motorship Brown Bear tied up in Seattle at Lake Union, recently, it brought interesting passengers from Alaska and the Aleutian Islands. A young south west Alaska bald eagle, for the Woodland Park Zoo. Dr. and Mrs. Olus J. Murie of Washington, D.C., are returning from the Aleutians. Dr. Murie gathered animals and birds, alive and stuffed, for the Biological Survey and National Museum, and Mrs. Murie is returning from a trip to St. Lawrence Island, an all-Eskimo area of 160 miles from Nome and 40 miles from Siberia. Ten-year old Joanne Murie, who summered at Fairbanks, was photographed pouring a tub of water for the tufted puffins which Dr. Murie brought back from the Aleutians. The puffin is a sea bird.
