FIVE SENTENCES ARE PASSED SAT. MORNING

In the U. S. District Court at Nome Saturday, Judge J. H. S. Morison passed sentence on six defendants whose pleas of guilty were entered to indictments last week returned by the Grand Jury.

Charley Jack was sentenced to the penitentiary for a period of five years for larceny in a warehouse.

Joe Bill and John Kivik were both sentenced to five years in the penitentiary for larceny in a dwelling at night.

Bill Kanyak received a sentence of 15 years for rape.

Wm. Blakely was sentenced to two years for illegal cohabitation.

Gertrude Nungasruk received a three months sentence in the federal jail for a like offense.

Discussing the crimes of the first four, Judge Morison promised that should they return here and become involved in any similar offenses following their prison terms, he would see to it that they stood prosecution under the "habitual criminal" statute which was enacted by the 1939 Legislature of the Territory of Alaska.

Richard Lee Jr. is a candidate on the Democratic ticket for the House of Representatives. They have additional plans for further operation of their two dredges in the Solomon River section during the coming year.

Barney Belleview, of the Belle view Bros. dredging operation on the Inmachuk River was a returning passenger by plane from Anchorage after spending the winter in the States. He expects to go north to Deering as soon as completing business here.

Departing Saturday for their homes at Kotzebue and Shungnak after attending court at Nome were the following: Deputy Marshal B. W. Neily, Tom Berryman and Annie Lee, the later returning to her home at Shungnak. They appeared as witnesses before the Grand Jury last week.

Airplane News

A special passenger trip was made yesterday by the PAA Electra. Passengers were Mr. and Mrs. L. B. Leech, Jack Anderson, Barney Belleview, Cy Ridont, Anton Malde, and E. Myntti.

The PAA mail plane arrived Nome from Fairbanks about 1 p. m. this afternoon. The plane carried 25 pouches of mail but no passengers and will return to Fairbanks tomorrow morning at 7 a.m.

MIROW ACTIVITIES

Pilot Jack Jefford, who arrived Nome Sunday afternoon in the MAS tri-motor Stinson with a load of passengers from Anchorage, flew nearly 800 miles in the fast time of five hours exactly, said Manager E. E. Roberts of the Mirow Air Service.

Due to fog in Rainy Pass and Broad Pass he had to fly nearly to Nenana, in line with Anchorage and Fairbanks, and then eastward to Nome. On the easterly flight, a 60-mile-per-hour wind helped him through. The flight was made non-stop.

Pilot Jefford left Nome at 2:45 a.m. today and arrived at Anchorage in the tri-motor at 7:45 a.m. According to the Mirow Air Service, pilot Sasseen then fueled the big ship, loaded in the passengers and took off for Nome, arriving about 3 p.m. today.

Passengers were: Luke Munz, Jack Thomas, Henry Wurman, Mr. and Mrs. Andre, Frances Markus, Ralph Smith and three others names unknown.

Pilot Sasseen will leave for Anchorage early tomorrow morning.

Pilot Chambers made a trip to Unakleet and brought in three passengers for Nome, John Mitchell, George Gemalis, Clement Bahr, and Frank Roberts, all from Unalakleet and Ungalik. Keith Victor was also brought in for hospitalization at the Maynard Columbus hospital.
