Congressman Charles Dick, who came to the front in 1896 when he was named by Mark Hanna as secretary of the republican national committee, has been chosen United States senator to succeed Senator Hanna for both the short term and the full term of six years beginning March 4, 1905. Mr. Dick has taken the late senator Hanna's place as the leader of the anti-Forker faction of Ohio republicans. At the present time the anti-Forker republicans constitute the regular republican organization in Ohio.

W. Bourke Cochran, who was retired from congress in 1895 by Tammany for his pro-Cleveland tendencies, has been chosen to fill the vacancy in the New York city congressional delegation, caused by the resignation of George B. McClellan when he became mayor. It was said that Charles A. Towne was slated for this position until Cochran asked for it. The promise now is that Towne will be included in the delegation to be chosen at the general election next fall.
