LOSE FLEET

Russian Vladivostock Squadron Reported As Being Captured or Destroyed By the Japanese Navy

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.]

London, March 9.—The Daily Telegraph this morning published a dispatch from Tokio, dated March 7, and saying: "It is reported here that the Japanese fleet engaged the Russian Vladivostock squadron at sea yesterday. The result of the engagement is not officially announced, but it is believed Russian ships were either destroyed or captured."

ENGLAND MAY MOVE FOR PEACE IN ORIENT

It is reported that the czar has requested King Edward to mediate between Japan and Russia and stop the war.

New York, March 9—A Vienna special to the New York Times says: "According to the News Freire Press, Count Beckendorff, the Russian ambassador at the Port of St. James, has returned to London bearing with him an autograph letter from the czar of Russia to King Edward, in which mention is made of an eventual British mediation, by arbitration, between Russia and Japan in the interest of peace."

ENGLAND CONSIDERING MEDIATION

London, March 9—Regarding the dispatch from the News Freire Press at Vienna to American papers with reference to British mediation between Russia and Japan, it is stated that in government circles here the matter has been a subject of discussion for some time.
