TROOPS GET TOGETHER

Japanese infantry occupy Ping Yang, close to Russian lines. Firing has commenced between outposts. Japs are supplied with Korean guns.

[Special Dispatch to the Daily Alaskan.]

St. Petersburg, March 19—The following cable has been received from Alexieff from Mukden: "General Mishtokento reports that Ping Yang is occupied by the Japanese infantry which is armed with same guns and supplies that Korean guards are carrying.

"The enemy's cavalry has not been visible in large bodies, and only isolated horsemen are seen. Their horses are very poor.

"Our patrols discovered the presence of the enemy's infantry on the banks of the Cheng Cheng river five verst, about 3 1/2 miles, from Anju. The enemy opened fire and killed one of our horses."

RUSSIANS WITHDRAWING FROM KOREA

Seoul, March 19—The report has been confirmed that the Russian horse artillery has been withdrawn to the north bank of the Yalu river and that part of the cavalry has also withdrawn, leaving only a weak post at Tyon Chyon south of Wiju.

JAPANESE BOATS WERE HURT

Port Arthur, March 19—According to information received from Russia from Shanghai in the fighting at Port Arthur on February 10th and 11th, the Japanese battleship Moesaka was struck by ten projectiles and was seriously damaged. The Japanese battleship and two cruisers are now docked for repairs at Nagasaki. At least two thousand and wounded Japanese are said to be in the Japanese hospitals.
