## RUSSIAN FLEET IS BADLY CRIPPLED

Tuesday's Battle Was Disasterous to the Attacking Ships of the Czar—Japan Holds Sea Without Obstruction

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.] London, April 16.—Baron Hayashi, the Japanese minister to England, declares that a positive disaster to the Russian ships at Port Arthur was the result of the Russian attack upon the fleet last Tuesday.

**Russian Fleet Suffers Terribly**  
St. Petersburg, April 16.—There are now only two undamaged Russian battleships in the harbor of Port Arthur, but some of the damaged vessels have been repaired and are fit for service.

**Russians Loot Korean Town**  
Seoul, April 16.—According to a report received by the Korean Court last night, hundreds of Russians entered Cwang Go prefecture of Phyon-Go and commandeered horses and stores, violated women and committed other atrocities. The garrison attacked the invaders and the Russians were forced to retreat, but there were some casualties among the Koreans.
