GO SLOW GOES FREE

Steamers on the Yukon More or Less Delayed James C. Beasley Acquitted of Forgery Charge

Whitehorse, May 16.—The Thistle arrived a Yukon Crossing last night at 8 o'clock, on her way to Dawson, after having been delayed by the ice running out of the slough. She will leave the Crossing this evening with a bunch of cattle scows.
The Columbian passed Selkirk at 10:45 o'clock last night on her way up the river.
The Canadian left Selwyn going down stream at 5 o'clock Saturday night. She had not reached Ogilvie this morning. There is no operator at Stewart today, so nothing could be learned from there.
The progress of all the boats is delayed by running ice.

Water Rising
The water at this place is slowly rising. It is now about six inches above extreme low water, showing a gain of two inches since the opening of the river.

HOT TIME AT DALNEY

Japanese fleet force entrance to the harbor and while they bombard town 20,000 soldiers attack in rear.

[Special Dispatches to Daily Alaskan.]

Chicago, May 17.—A special to the Chicago News from Chefoo says when the Daily News dispatch boat Fawn arrived off Dalney early yesterday morning a heavy bombardment was in progress. As the channel was thickly mined by the Russians and as the Japanese Admiral Kattukao had issued orders that non-comatants' boats be excluded, it was impossible to get within the roadstead, hence accurate reports of the proceedings were impossible. However, it is known that an armored cruiser, the Yakumo, four other cruisers, one gunboat and one battleship having cleared the channel entered the harbor shortly after daylight, and began heavy firing which was still in progress at noon. It is estimated that 20,000 Japanese were investing town, and there is every reason to believe that they have been successful and are now in possession of the town. It is understood the landing of the second Japanese army was completed yesterday and there are now 50,000 Japanese troops on the Lioating peninsula.
