City Council Calls Election for June 21

The city council called an election last night for seven councilmen and a school board consisting of one director, a clerk and a treasurer. The election will take place June 21, the third Tuesday in June, the date fixed by the city ordinance for the municipal election.

The council decided to hold an election notwithstanding that it is doubtful if one can be legal unless it be held the first Tuesday in April, the date prescribed by the congressional municipal incorporation act for the election of councilmen. It seems to be the consensus of legal opinion that this doubt as to the legality of the election will not apply to the school board, as no specific date is named for their election.

The following were named as judges for election: Phil Abrahams, F. B. Wurzbacher and H. D. Clark.

H. G. Dickson Writes of the Name, "Labarge"

To the Editor: In your issue of the 3rd inst., I notice a letter of inquiry regarding the proper name of the lake which lies between Fifty-mile and Thirty-mile rivers.

If the matter is not already closed, I may give you some information. The Canadian geographic board of Ottawa adopted the name Le-a-b-a-r-g-e, presumably after a Canadian of that name. The United States geographic board, according to Marcus Baker, who was authorized by the librarian of congress to compile a list of Alaska names, while giving the ruling of the Canadian board in that respect, adopted the Le-a-b-a-r-g-e, claiming that that was the form used by Michael Lebarge himself after whom the lake was named.

As all rulings of the Canadian board were made authoritative by order in council dated December 18, 1897, the spelling adopted by it is official, at any rate in Canada. Respectfully,
