## GET JURY

Twelve Men Selected to Try Nan Patterson

New York, April 20—A jury of 12 men has been selected to try Nan Patterson for the murder of Caesar Young. The trial was adjourned until Monday when the statements will be made and the introduction of testimony begun. The last preliminary challenge was exhausted last night.

It is said the prosecution has much new evidence which will be introduced at this trial for the first time. Among the things which it will try to prove is that the murder is the result of a conspiracy to swindle Young out of his fortune. Mrs. Smith, Nan Patterson's sister, is also said to be a party to the conspiracy.

The jury selected last night is the third which has been sequestered in this case. The first was discharged because of the illness of one of its members. The second jury disagreed.

### Quick Trip to Fairbanks

J. A. Cameron, deputy collector of internal revenue, made the trip from Eagle to Fairbanks last month in 57 hours. The time is remarkably fast and indicative of the possibilities of the Yukon route to the Tanana.

### Yukon Gains in Numbers

The population of the Yukon territory is gaining. In March there were 11 births reported and six deaths. Of the latter, five were from natural causes. There were three weddings.

## Russian Fleet At Anchor

Russian ships taking on coal and undergoing repairs at anchor in French-Indo China ports. Fleets are in two divisions.

Saigon, Cochin China, April 20—The Russian fleet is still in Kamranh bay.

St. Petersburg, April 20—The Russian Baltic fleet now in the China sea is in two divisions. One of them is taking on coal and undergoing repairs at anchor in Kamranh bay, French Indo-China, and the other division is likewise engaged in Turin bay, some distance farther north on the coast.

Japanese cruisers and commerce destroyers have captured a great number of Russian colliers and supply ships on the coast of Cochin China.

### ANOTHER LAND BATTLE EXPECTED

St. Petersburg, April 20—It is expected that there will be fighting in Manchuria again within a short time. The Japanese have pushed their advance until they hang close on both the Russian flanks which they are pressing.

### JAPANESE PROTEST TO FRANCE

Paris, April 20—Japan formally protested today against France's allowing the Russian fleet to have anchorage in Kamranh bay. The French government has replied that it is not violating the laws of neutrality, saying the Russians are within the three mile limit.

## AFTER EXCURSION TRADE FOR SKAGWAY

W. P. & Y. R. and Alaskan Steamship Companies Offer Inducements for Excursionists to Tarry in Alaska and Go Inside

The W. P. & Y. R. and the steamship companies that are operating on the route between Puget sound and British Columbia ports and Alaska are making a special effort to induce tourists to visit the north this year, and to extend their trips into the interior. Special round trip rates have been made between the southern points and Dawson and Atlin for that purpose.

An agreement has been entered into by which the steamship companies or the W. P. & Y. R. will sell these excursion tickets after June 10. They will be good until September 15.

The rates for excursion parties of 15 or more, not exceeding 25, will be \$120 each to Atlin and \$160 to Dawson. This will include all expenses on the trip.

Hotel bills and hack hire, when in Skagway, Atlin and other points, will be included in the service given the tourists, except that on the Dawson

trip the passengers must pay their own expenses when waiting for connections with steamers on the Yukon or from Skagway.

The tourists will be given a trip to Denver glacier and other points of interest in the vicinity of Skagway. They also will be provided a trip up Pine creek in the Atlin district and up the Klondike creeks from Dawson.

In parties of a lesser number than 15 the rate on the Dawson trip will be \$165.

To those who desire to take in both Atlin and Dawson the rate is \$180.

The tickets are good on any of the steamship lines, and may be used one way on one line and the other way on another line.

Those who desire to remain over at Skagway can do so by asking permission and by paying their own additional expenses at hotels and for other purposes.
