WIN TWO

Skagway Defeats Whitehorse on the Diamond

Skagway outplayed Whitehorse at baseball Saturday and Sunday at every point, winning a game each day with ease. The score Saturday was 11 to 6 in favor of Skagway and yesterday it was 10 to 2. The home team had an inning to spare in each game.

The Whitehorse team is weaker than it has been in most of the contests with Skagway, but it would have to be much stronger than it is to win when Skagway plays ball as it did Saturday and Sunday. Considering that it has not had any practice since the Victoria Day game and little before that this season, the home team showed up in excellent form. Particularly clean was the playing yesterday.

Dr. Nicholson, the regular pitcher of the Whitehorse team, refused to play Saturday and William Wright went into the box. He did very well. Sunday, Whitehorse borrowed Barragar from Skagway, but the team was defeated worse than ever, though Barragar struck out 10 men. T. Barry and R. Gault, of Skagway, also played for Whitehorse, Sunday. Busam, of the Third infantry, played for Skagway.

Gault and Phelps made an excellent battery for Skagway in both games. Gault struck out 10 men Saturday and Sunday five men went down before him. Those who did find the ball seldom put it beyond the infield. Phelps let only one ball pass him Saturday and his vigilance kept the base runners bugging their bags.

The fielding of Champagne was the most sensational feature of the playing. He covered the entire left field and took into camp everything that came his way.

Skagway played good fast ball at all points. The in and outfields were well covered and the batting strong. Of Skagway's players O'Brien, Phelps, Blanchard and Pinneo were exceptionally strong at the bat, and O'Brien at first was perfect. McIntyre played in the field the first time in Skagway, Saturday, and covered himself with glory.

Clarence Olsen umpired Saturday's game and H. H. Kirmse, Sunday's. Both gave excellent satisfaction and there was little unseemly wrangling.
