Princess Beatrice Arrives From the South

The Canadian Pacific liner *Princess Beatrice* arrived in port yesterday evening at 8 o'clock with 42 passengers, 350 tons of freight and one day's mail from Seattle.

The *Princess Beatrice* will remain in port until tomorrow night when she will sail for the south with the mining engineer's excursion who are expected to arrive at Whitehorse tomorrow morning on the *Whitehorse* and *Dawson*.

JUNEAU WILL HAVE PUBLIC LIBRARY

Each of the members of the excursion, to the number of more than 150, agreed to purchase a book, as soon as Seattle shall have been reached on the return trip, which will be sent back to Juneau. Skagway Pioneer Looking For Lost Mine

S. P. Panton, a pioneer of Skagway, a Montana life insurance man, and his brother Dr. Panton, of Portland, Oregon, are said to be in Alaska searching for a mine located by a patient of the physician to whom he told of it upon his death bed.

The prospector was a French Canadian and his property is supposed to be in the vicinity of Juneau.

The *Anaconda Standard*, which got the story of the lost mine from Mr. Panton, says when the prospector finally realized that death was near he "called for paper and pencil and excluded all from the room except Dr. Panton. To the physician he gave minute directions as to where he had found the gold. He drew rough sketches of the country and with the last stroke of the pencil he breathed his last."

Dr. Panton notified his brother of the prospector's story, and they left for the north as soon as possible.
