LACEY RIGHT AGAIN

Representative Lacey spoke with knowledge when he said at Seattle that Alaska is not so large or its interests so diversified but that one man could properly represent it in congress. It is true that three could do better than one, but the thing wanted above all else is to get a delegate, authorized to speak for the district, who is responsible to the people for his acts.

Speaker Cannon is said to have contended that a man from Seattle could better represent Nome than one from Juneau and that he could better represent Southeastern Alaska than could one from Nome. That is not in line with human experience and was doubtlessly uttered unthinkingly. It is not so much the residence of a representative that counts as it is to whom he is indebted for his credentials.

Washington senators and congressmen or the self-appointed delegates from various sections of Alaska are not proper representatives of the people of this district because they are not answerable to them. The thing that is absolutely necessary is to put the delegate in congress in such a position that he must account for his stewardship to the people.

The boom that was started for Gov. Folk, of Missouri, for the presidency by Gov. Hoch, of Kansas, has received a hard blow in the Sunflower state. It has been learned that Gov. Folk drinks whiskey and that he does not pretend that it is for "the stomach's sake." The indictment against the Missouri goes into particulars. It is alleged that he takes his whiskey straight or in high balls. It is doubtful if Gov. Hoch's endorsement will offset that offense against the Kansas idea of propriety. It is said, however, in defense of graft fighting executive that he eschews cocktails. That ought to help some.

The Nome chamber of commerce seems to have committed itself to the idea of having a territorial convention to discuss the legislative needs of Alaska at Seattle. That is wrong. If there is to be an all-Alaskan convention, and there should be one, it must, for obvious reasons, be held in Alaska.

The time of year has arrived when the people should begin to prepare against fire during the coming winter. One of the very best precautions that could be taken would be to tear down a few more of the old shacks that continue to encumber some of the streets and alleys of the town.
