Parties arriving from the north report that Mount Wrangell is in active eruption again and the Indians say it has been dormant for thirteen years.

The chairman and secretary of the Republican Territorial Central Committee have decided to issue a call for a meeting on Thursday, December 14. It will likely be held at Cordova. The members of this committee are as follows: Sam Blum, chairman, Valdez and Cordova; Harry G. Steel, secretary; E. L. Harwood, Cordova; S. M. Graef, Seward; J. H. Heckman, Ketchikan; Carl Sphun, Killisnoo; M. J. O'Connor, Douglas; Elwood Bruner, J. C. Browne, George D. Schofield, Nome; T. A. Markham, L. L. James, Fairbanks; Fred Carter, Iditarod. It will be the duty of this committee to fix the time and place for holding the Republican territorial convention, and to decide on the ratio of representation, which heretofore has been on the basis of one delegate for every 20 votes cast at the previous delegate election for the Republican candidate. The convention, in addition to nominating a candidate for delegate to Congress, will also elect two delegates and two alternates to the National Republican convention, and a new territorial central committee. The National Republican committee will meet in Washington on December 12 and fix a time and place for holding the National convention, and to provide for the election of 1,072 delegates. It is generally believed that it will be held some time in June and at Chicago. —Chitina Leader.
