Halibut is high.

Fifty men are working on the new cannery at Ward Point, near Wrangell.

The Sixteenth Infantry will be transferred from Fort Seward to the States next summer.

The number of Alaska insane persons cared for in the asylum was 145 on July 16 last, as against 120 on the same date in 1910.

Lieut. Col. Wilde P. Richardson, president of the Alaska road commission, fell on the icy pavement at Washington, D. C., and broke his ankle.

A Wrangell preacher took for his text the words "Getting Hot," which we may take either as up-to-date slang, or a hint as to the place some of the Wrangell folks are bound for.

The Grand Trunk Pacific Ry., which has almost completed its route from Winnipeg to the Pacific coast, will build a large floating dry dock at Rupert, with complete electrical and machine shops in connection.

The Seward Gateway says that late last fall Messrs. Sargent and Bayley and their crews, of the United States geological survey, acting upon orders from Dr. Brooks, made a complete survey of the Alaska Northern line, as far as mile 59.

The Skagway Alaskan declares that the suit of the United States against the White Pass & Yukon Ry. has been dropped. In this case the White Pass was accused of shipping in Canadian laborers to take the jobs away from American longshoremen at Skagway.

The North Pacific Wharves & Trading Co., better known as the Moore's Wharf Co., of Skagway, has asked that an order of the court be issued enjoining the City of Skagway from handling coal. The case has been set for final hearing at the Skagway term in June.

In his annual report Gov. Clark says that the density of the white population in Alaska is about 1 to 19 square miles. Of the fourteen incorporated towns in the territory in 1910, five increased in population between 1900 and 1910, five decreased, and four are towns which did not exist in the former year.

There are now fifteen incorporated towns in the territory, one of them (Iditarod) having been added this year. The nine incorporated towns which caused an assessment of property to be made and a tax to be levied this year report a total assessed valuation of \$7,669,047. The tax rate of these towns ranges from one-half of one per cent to two per cent, the average being 1.6 per cent.—Governor's report.

Next to mining, the fishing industry is the most productive in the territory, says the Governor's report. In the calendar year 1910 there were employed in the several branches of the fisheries 15,620 persons, an increase of 3,032 over 1909. Of these 6,836 were whites, 4,147 Indians, and 4,637 Orientals. The most gratifying feature is the large increase in the number of whites and natives employed, as all the natives and many of the whites are permanent residents of Alaska. The total investment in the fisheries last year was \$20,711,422.

The singular lack of certain laws applicable to Alaska—all or nearly all of which laws have been enacted for or extended to every other territory under the jurisdiction of the United States—is a matter which should be neglected no longer, says the Governor in his report. These measures, which belong to a minor class of legislation, but are important absolutely, are as follows: 1. Territorial quarantine law. 2. Sanitation and public health. 3. Registration of vital statistics. 4. Supervision of banks. 5. Compulsory school attendance. 6. Relief of destitution.

Nome Nugget—For the past week the question of diseased reindeer meat loaded down with germs has been the subject of considerable discussion. The Nugget in order to get at the bottom of the whole matter has been investigating the rumors for the past three days, and on Thursday last found that the Pacific Cold Storage Company had dressed a reindeer literally filled with tapeworms and eggs of the same germs. The meat was such that the Cold Storage company had the local doctors investigate the same. Doctor Neuman was called in and he took samples of the eggs and developed tapeworms from them.

Horace J. Stevens, of Houghton, Michigan, editor and publisher of the Copper Hand Book, and a noted mining engineer, in a speech delivered before the American Mining Congress, said, in commenting on the Bonanza copper mine, in the Copper river valley: "As a matter of fact, the Guggenheim's control a copper mine in the interior of Alaska that is a wonder in its way, yet cannot be rated at more than a third-class property. The mine, the Bonanza, is a sort of copper-plated gold brick, in that an interior core of limestone is surrounded by phenomenally high-grade bornite and copper glance. No competent mining men who have visited this property have estimated the amount of ore in sight and safely to be inferred, as capable of producing more than 100,000,000 pounds of finished copper, a total production equivalent to only one year's maximum output by any one of the six leading copper mines of the world."
