## CANADIAN TOWN COMPLETELY DESTROYED BY TERRIBLE ROCKSLIDE

Top of Turtle Mountain Pours Down Upon Town of Frank, Crushing Houses As Egg Shells and Mashing People Into Mince-meat.  
Over 100 Lives Lost and an Unknown Number Injured

[Special Dispatch to Daily Alaskan.]

Cranbrook, B. C., April 30.—A terrible rock slide from Turtle mountain completely demolished the little coal mining town of Frank, just across the line in Alberta, at 4 o'clock yesterday morning. More than one hundred lives were crushed out and an unknown number were injured.

The whole top of Turtle mountain seemed to be lifted off as if by an earthquake or by a terrible eruption, and was hurled down upon the top of the little city which nestled close to the foot of the mountain. The rocks and boulders poured down the mountain side, crushing houses as though they were egg shells and mashing the panic-stricken population into mince-meat.

A large number of coal miners have been entombed in the side of the mountain; the great mass of rock having closed the mouth of the tunnels and shafts. Seventeen of them have thus far been recovered.

Relief has been sent to the stricken community in the way of men to help with the rescue work, nurses and physicians to minister to the wounded and dying, and provisions for those who were fortunate enough to escape the terrible fate which overtook so large a proportion of the little city's population.

All last night and all of today the work of recovering the dead and the wounded from the tremendous mass of wreckage has progressed. The rescuers have worked without intermission ever since the frightful death-dealing avalanche swept down upon and

over the town, 36 hours ago, and all the ground has not yet been worked over, though the loss of life is known to exceed 100.

The scenes that are being enacted upon the disordered site where peacefully lived a thriving and contented half thousand people 48 hours ago, are sad beyond description. There has been found scarcely a survivor from the terrible wreck who has not lost one or more members of his immediate family, and all have lost friends by the score. In many instances whole families have been wiped out of existence.

Frank was a town of about 500 souls, situated on the Crow's Nest branch of the Canadian Pacific railroad, just across the eastern line of British Columbia, in Alberta. It has been absolutely destroyed.
