Knudson Probably Recommended for Dismissal

A Washington dispatch of September 12, says the record of the court martial which tried Lieut. Knud Knudson, of the Seventh Infantry, on charges of having embezzled funds and made irregular uses of quartermaster's stores in Alaska, was received at the war department today. The case now awaits the action of the president. Although no official statement is obtainable at the war department, it is believed that the sentence of the court is dismissal from the army.
