## May Beatrice and City of Seattle in

The water front has been busy since Saturday afternoon. The Princess May arrived in port Saturday evening having been delayed at Eslington, where freight and passengers were discharged in the ship's boat. She has 200 tons of freight, 20 passengers and a full mail for Skagway. She sailed yesterday morning with one of the largest passenger lists to leave Skagway this season. She had 150 people out of Skagway. Her accommodations for passengers were limited for the reason that she had to stop at Wrangell for two survey parties which have been engaged on the boundary survey.

The Princess Beatrice arrived in port at 6 o'clock this morning with a few passengers and a small quantity of mail. She will sail tomorrow evening. The City of Seattle arrived in port this morning at 9 o'clock. She also had only a few passengers and a small quantity of freight. She will sail this evening with a large list of southbound passengers.

## W. B. POLAND GETS NEW JOB

W. B. Poland, member of the American Society of C. E., who resigned from the Alaska Central Railroad, September 1st, has been elected vice president and chief engineer of the Philippine Railway Company. He sails for Manila about November 1st to take charge of construction and other interests for the syndicate which is building railroads on the islands Panay, Negros and Cebu. His address will be 43 Exchange Place, New York and Manila, P. I.

The survey of these roads was started about the middle of June, under the direction of E. J. Board of J. G. White & Company, New York, who have the contract for the engineering and construction of these lines.

At the present time survey have been completed for 60 miles on the island of Panay, 50 miles and 50 miles on Cebu, this being about one-half of the total mileage.

Whitehorse, Oct. 8.—The Dawson arrived yesterday morning with 156 passengers for Skagway and the Selkirk got in at 11 p. m. with 80 passengers. The Whitehorse will be due today with a big passenger list. She was at Hootalinqua at 8 a. m. The Victorian, coming up stream, was at Selkirk at 4:30 a. m. The Dawson sailed for Dawson at 4:30 a. m. with 200 tons of freight and 18 passengers. The Selkirk will sail today as soon as she shall have been loaded.

## IMMIGRATION MAN IS HERE

Kazis Kraucunas, inspector in the United States immigration service, is in Skagway again and will see to the enforcement of the immigration laws on the White Pass. The law requires that all foreigners except Canadians, coming into the United States, must contribute \$2 to the national exchequer and they must be men or women who will make desirable citizens.

Mr. Kraucunas will go through each of the trains of the White Pass, and those who he thinks should be excluded from the United States will be required to proceed to a Canadian port, while those foreigners, with the exception stated, will be required to pay as provided by law.

Mr. Kraucunas is at the Pullen house.
