Storm Lashes Fleet

Ryukyu islands.

The thunderous sea ripped off one hundred four feet of her prow and "tossed it aside as though it was a match box to wallow in the storm off the ship's port side."

Captain John Gingrich ordered the engines reversed and swung the six hundred sixty-five foot ship precariously around in a circle to escape collision with her own bow, and came out in the dead calm of the storms center.

Sealed bulkheads kept the Pittsburgh afloat. The cruiser normally is capable of thirty-three knots and came back to Guam at nine knots.

The bow was taken in tow by a tug and brought back to port. The ships which suffered damage and returned to action include Essex class carriers Hornet and Bennington, battleships Massachusetts, Indiana and Alabama, Independence class type carriers San Jacinto, Belleauwood, destroyer John Rodgers, and carrier Bougainville.

The M. S. Meteor left for Unalakleet Wednesday with a capacity load of freight. This is Captain William's first trip to that point from Nome this season. His house barge is specially constructed to protect the freight from the elements and to make it possible to carry all the freight waiting for him on the various points of his route north and south of Nome.
